Hello and welcome to our 2015 newsletter and information on our 3^{rd} annual Helmsman Ram sale. We hope 2015 finds you and your family well.

The season started slowly following a dry spring and heatwave conditions in November 2014. All in the local area will remember the terrible fire in the Kadungle/Tullamore area for a while. Once the heat was over, and it started to rain 2015 provided us with vastly improved wool prices and solid lamb and mutton markets. Things look positive for the 2016 markets.

Firstly we welcomed Eliza Kelly who is undergoing a Traineeship with us. Eliza has been a fantastic addition to our operation & we are sure will go well at anything she undertakes.

Paul Kelly joins us as our sheep classer, Paul comes from a background with vast experience in management in the Stud & Commercial Merino industry.

In February, we completed a successful Al program using Pooginook 110311 across 100 stud ewes. This ram was selected by progeny sired in 2014. Our ewes were selected on their progeny history of previous two years. This is to strengthen our genetic base. We are looking forward to the results.

In March, Plevna Merinos hosted their second Bredwell Fedwell workshop. This workshop was presented by Jason Tromph, and Megan Rogers of Sheepsmart. These workshops focus on the breeding ewe which is the main profit driver in the sheep industry. Developing breeding objectives & ram selection with the aid of Breeding Values was also covered. 16 participants registered with all surveyed noting how helpful the day was to their flocks.


